ST. PAUL OF TARSUS

St Paul was born at Tarsus in Cilicia a few years after the birth of Christ. A tent maker by trade, the well educated Saul bitterly persecuted the Christian Jews. Saul, following an 'encounter' with the Lord on the road to Damascus, became a Christian – a follower of Jesus.

After being baptized, Paul zealously began a life of prayer and travel to bring the good news of Jesus to many people. After some 30 years of missionary work, he was taken as a prisoner to be tried before Caesar. After his first trial, he was released for a while, but was again arrested, condemned to death and was beheaded in the year 67 A.D.

St. Paul's main message was that both Jews and Gentiles (non-Jewish people), through faith and acceptance of the gospel, could enter into eternal life with the Risen Christ.

During St. Paul's lifetime, and as a result of his work, Jesus' disciples turned their energies to the worldwide missions of bringing the good news of Jesus to all people.

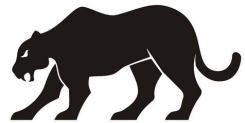
Senior and Junior Boys' volleyball teams. Both teams have had a great season with lots of success. Congratulations boys!
